Onboard Information

For any information, please do not hesitate to call "FARE MAEVA" (Reception ** 9). We will be happy to answer any questions or requests you may have.

In your room, you will find a compendium with the "Onboard Directory" as well as the "Excursions Booklet" for all optional activities.

Every evening at the bar during cocktail hours, your Guest Relation will meet you for an informal briefing about the next day activities and will present our selection of optional excursions.

Every day after dinner, you will find in your room the Daily Program for the next day.

Activities

Your "Nomade Yachting" experience includes the following activities: Tahitian Ahima'a feast on a "motu", Faaroa river kayak expedition and visit of a private botanical garden, beach barbecue, "motu" cinema under the stars, champagne breakfast in the lagoon, visit of a pearl farm, sunset cocktail trek up Mount Tapioi and transfers to "motu" islets.

All optional excursions descriptions are posted in the "Excursions Booklet" placed in the compendium box in your cabin. This booklet is not exhaustive and we will be delighted to arrange any special activity for you. Contact Fare Maeva.

Your Cabin

- Luggage storage:

You will find under your bed a storage area for your luggage. If you wish to have your luggage stored in a locker, please call Fare Maeva 29 9.

- Air conditioning:

Your cabin is equipped with an individual air conditioning regulator. Press on the arrows up or down to change the temperature.

- TV & DVD:

Your cabin is equipped with a LCD flat screen T and a DVD player for your enjoyment. Choose from our selection in the library and inquire at Fare Maeva to get the disc.

Beach Activities

- Sun protection:

Sun in French Polynesia is strong and we therefore highly recommend that you wear appropriate sunscreen protection whenever you are on decks, or on "motu".

Beach bag:

For your convenience, you will find a beach bag in your wardrobe.

- Swimming from the yacht:

We do not recommend swimming from the yacht's aft deck as it can be dangerous due to strong currents and the yacht's motion. However, it is possible to kayak from the aft deck but we recommend that you stay within the yacht anchoring area.

- Corals & Shells:

Bora Bora Cruises is very much involved in the protection of the environment, and we would like to advise you that it is strictly prohibited to take live shells or corals from the lagoons. When snorkelling, please be careful not to break corals. We also recommend not to touch them as some varieties can cause itching.

Sea Urchins:

Please be careful when swimming/snorkelling not to touch sea urchins as these can cause painful stings.

- Tender service to the "motu" islets:

We organize a permanent tender rotation during our "motu" time. We recommend that you wear beach sandals for wet landings.

Mineral water, towels, kayaks (and life jackets) as well as snorkelling equipment are always available on the numerous "motu" we visit.

General Information

- Smoking:

We would like to remind you that you are sailing on an non-smoking yacht. However, you may smoke on the outside decks only.

- Cabin keys:

For security reasons, we kindly ask you to drop your keys at Fare Maeva when you leave the yacht. It is our way to check you In & Out.

- Library:

Books and DVDs are available from the library. We kindly ask you to them back after reading/viewing so that other guests can enjoy them as well. To open library cupboards, gently push the middle frame.

- When we sail:

As a precaution, we suggest that anything in your cabin that could fall due to ocean movement is well stowed.
