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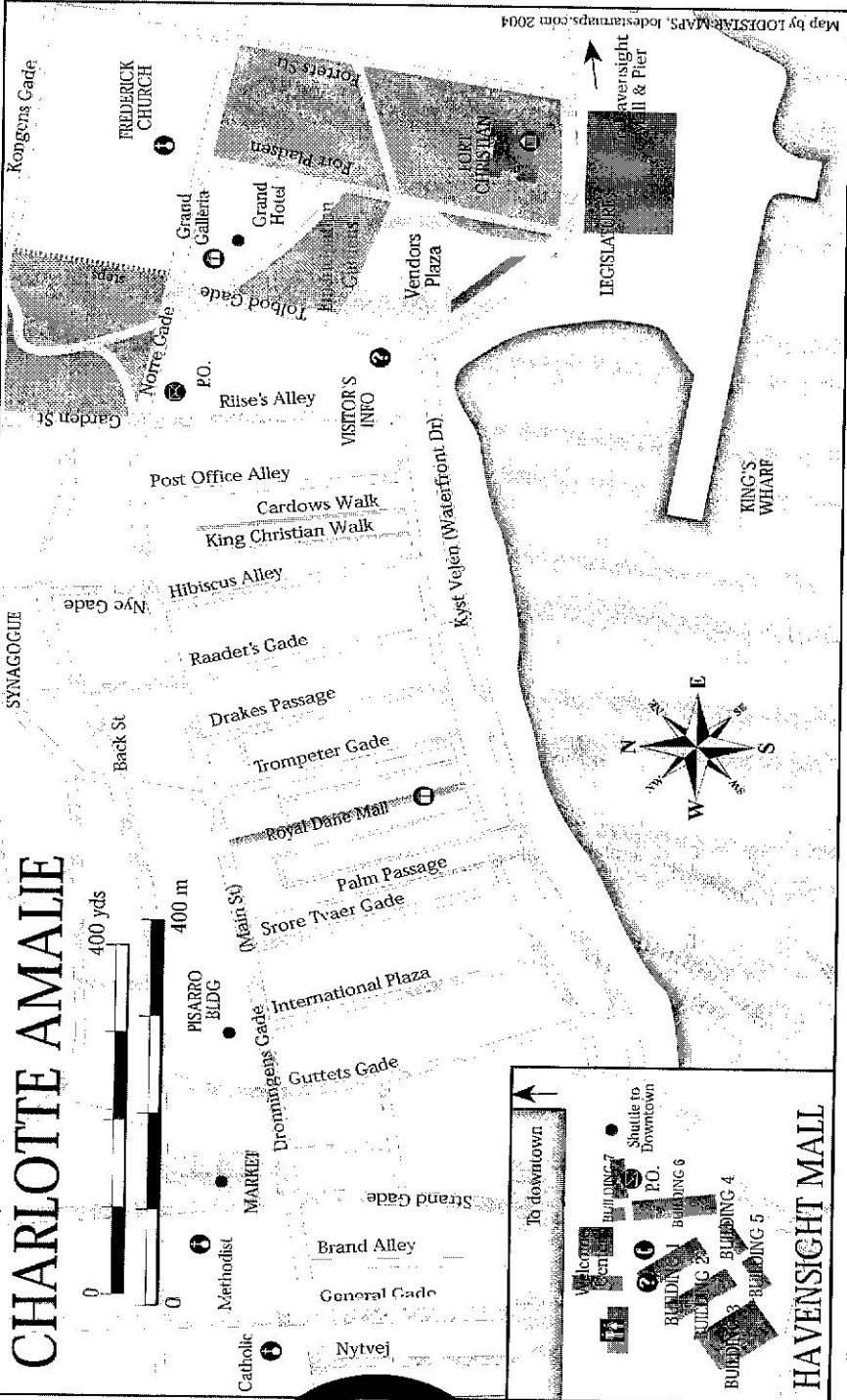
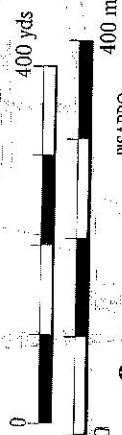

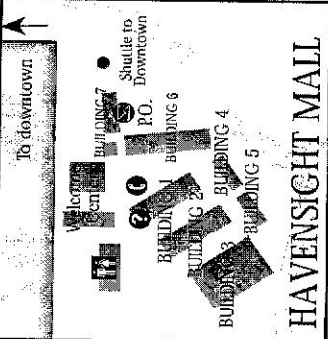

LEGISLATURE BUILDING

The USVI government is similar to the 50 United States. The Senate meets in an old Danish police barracks dating from 1874. The distinctive green building is just off King's Wharf near the waterfront. If the Territorial Assembly is in session, debates can be entertaining and educational. Nearby Emancipation Garden recalls the 1848 Danish liberation of slaves, nearly 20 years before the Emancipation Proclamation. The Danes had already abolished slave trade five decades earlier.

FORT CHRISTIAN

Across the garden from the Legislature, stands one of the oldest intact structures in the Virgin Islands. Fort Christian was dedicated in 1678. The stronghold walls once formed the colonial boundaries. Visit the dungeons, where a museum contains relics from earlier times. The Fort was begun in 1671 when King Christian V offered official sponsorship to the lucrative St. Thomas colony.

GOVERNMENT HOUSE

Government House mansion was built in the mid-1860s, and serves as administrative headquarters for the USVI territory. The gates are guarded (with permission)

might be able to visit. Nearby Hotel 1829 and Crown House are examples of 18th century colonial architecture.

SEVEN ARCHES MUSEUM

The seven arches are adornments to an 18th-century West Indian style Danish great house. The kitchen, slave quarters, and furnishings provide insight into lifestyles of the past. Still a private residence, the owners live on the first floor, leaving the second floor open as a museum.

SYNAGOGUE

St. Thomas has the second oldest synagogue in the western hemisphere. Jewish people have lived in St. Thomas for more than three centuries. As the Caribbean region grew financially and socially, members of the Jewish community have remained active partners in both political and philanthropic activities.

FREDERICK'S CHURCH

Frederick's is the second oldest Lutheran church in the New World. The Gothic revival style church, dedicated in 1793, opens from 8:00am to 5:00pm Monday through Saturday.

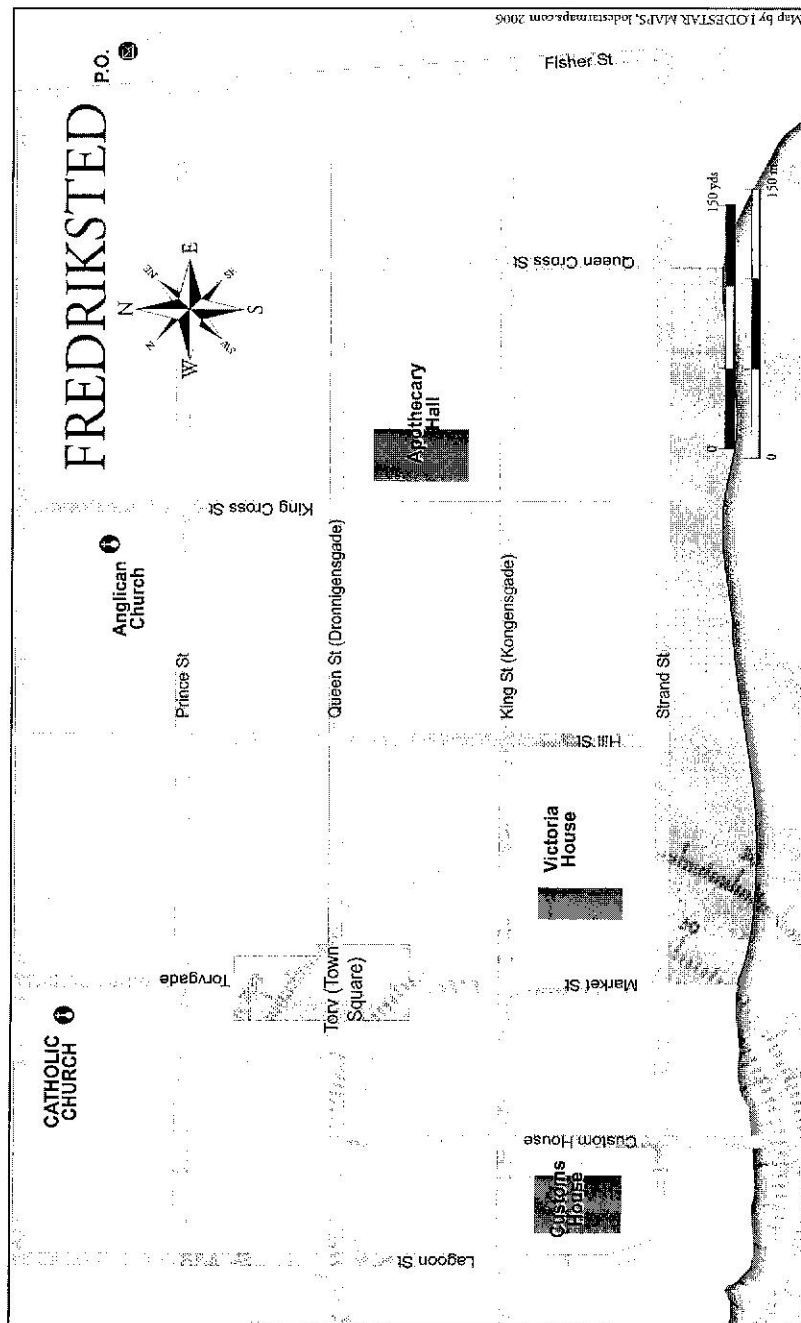
SEADREAMS of ISLAND HERITAGE

Because of the sharp changes in altitude from the shores to the island's interior, staircases were built to accommodate foot traffic as the colony expanded. Completed in the mid-1700s by Danish builders, the 99 Steps provided relatively easy access to navigate the steep hill. The bricks were once ballast for ships carrying immigrants to the port. Passengers are advised that there really are more than 100 steps. At the top of the staircase is Blackbeard's Castle.

Originally known as Skytsborg,

Blackbeard's Castle tower, dating from 1679, is considered by some to be the oldest extant structure in the Virgin Islands. The castle was reputedly headquarters for the notorious Edward Teach, also known as Blackbeard, and is designated as a National landmark. The current tenant runs a popular restaurant and hotel. The atmosphere are both excellent.

Some historians have suggested that Drake was a pirate. From his Drake's Seat observation point he guarded his fleet. Nearby, **St. Peter Greathouse**, now a gallery for local artists, is set in the lush Botanical Garden



FREDERIKSTED

"F"-sted's" 18th-century **Fort Frederik**, first foreign garrison to salute the US flag (1776), is a perfect place to begin exploring St. Croix. Completed in 1760 and modified nearly a century later, the distinctive red and white fort is a historical museum. The old garrison houses an art gallery. Governor General Peter von Scholten ("gently" prompted by the appearance of 8,000 angry slaves) proclaimed emancipation in 1848 at the site (Denmark had outlawed slave trade 45 years earlier).

Frederiksted itself is an open-air museum of colonial design. Much of the town was damaged in an 1867 earthquake and fire, and the "Fireburn Revolt" claimed the commercial district 11 years later. The port was rebuilt in popular Victorian style of the era. The largest church is (coral) **St. Patrick's Catholic Church** at the intersection of Prince and Market Streets, an 1842-built survivor. There are also several other late colonial churches, but if you tire of looking at buildings, follow **Mahogany Road** to groves of majestic (protected) mahogany trees.

LAWAETZ MUSEUM

Karl and Marie Lawaetz bought the mid-18th century farm after they emigrated from Denmark in 1899. The family lovingly

restored the old home. Though sugar was originally grown on the land, the Lawaetz family raised fruit and later livestock was tended on the farm. The family still owns the home – compare your guide's face with the family portraits inside!

ESTATE WHIM PLANTATION

Even the oval design of 19th-century Estate Whim Sugar Plantation is unusual. There are only three rooms, and the exterior (stone, brick, and molasses) walls are 3 feet thick! Just 2 miles from Frederiksted, St. Croix Landmarks Society restored and maintains the property. Besides the thick walls, a surrounding (dry) moat helps cool the house. An antique apothecary, kitchen (separate building), and windmill also remain. The site features a well-stocked gift shop. Nearby, **St. George Botanical Garden**, a series of simulated island ecosystems, features 17 floral acres

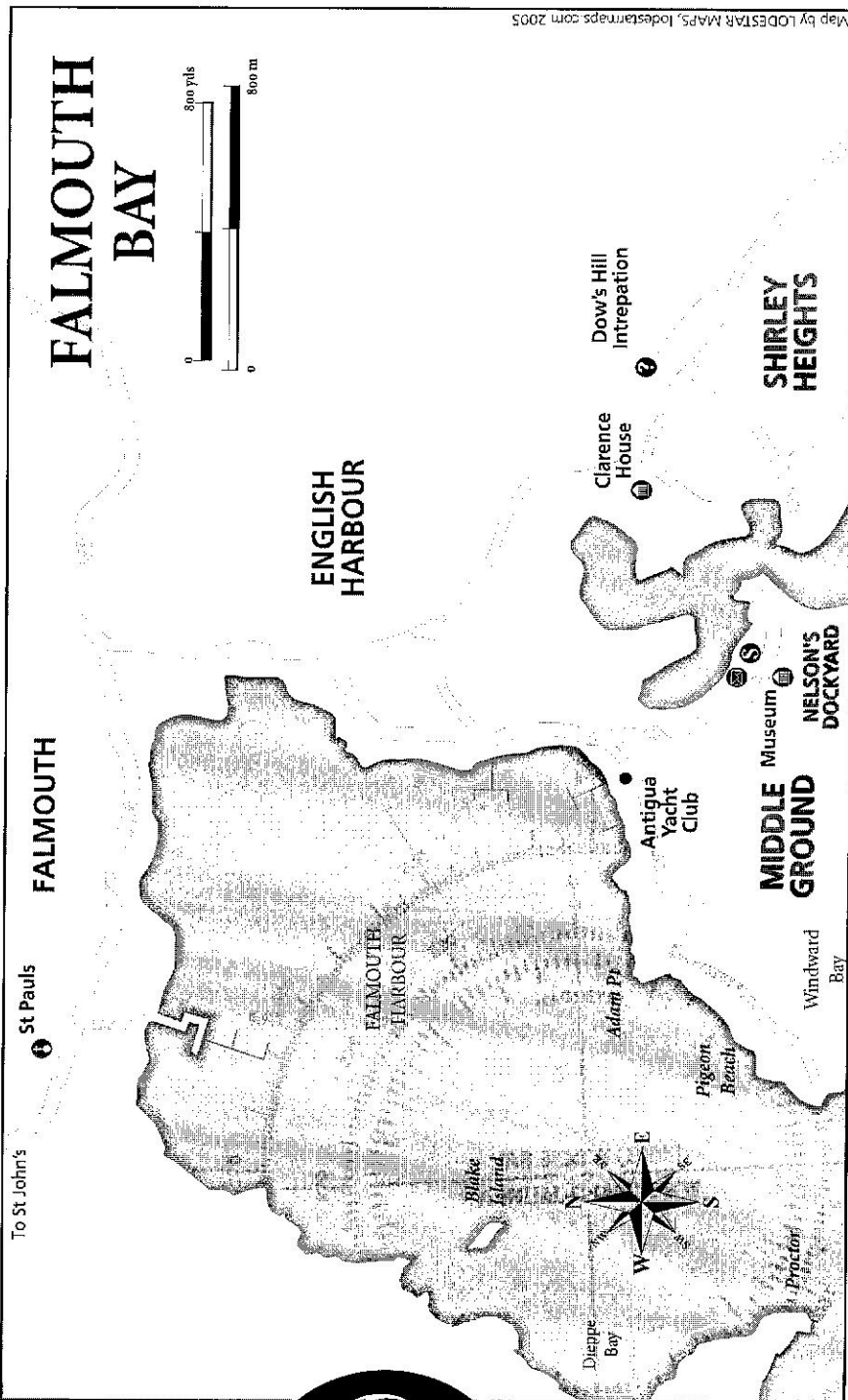

Sedreams of MARINE ACTIVITIES

Palm-lined beaches line all of St. Croix's inviting shores, although the best stretches of sand line the northern coast. **Cane Bay** is a fairly accessible and offers a stunning beach. **Frederiksted Beach**, just north of the pier (within easy walking distance), is also a pleasant place. Surfers generally find their way to the central northern shore. **Northside Beach, Ham's Bay, and Spat Hall Beach** are rugged, but picturesque.

Other fine beaches can be found at **Protestant Cay and Davis Bay. Cramer Park**, on the east shore, has changing facilities and showers. Offshore **Buck Island** is also a popular swimming and snorkeling destination. Boats link to the islet, which is six miles from Christensted.

The island is also popular among divers. The wall off Cane Bay drops 450 feet and is home to a vast array of colorful fish and marine plant life. There is also a rich undersea canyon off **Salt River**, but divers can also explore **Frederiksted Pier**, where sponges and plume have colonized the deep-seated pilings. Loads of tiny yellow, orange, and red seahorses frolic in the marine "forest." *St. Croix beaches are public, but hotels are allowed to assess minor entry fees.*

ENGLISH HARBOR

English Harbor, on Antigua's southern coast, is a naturally protected port. The center of

Antigua's historic district, its main focus is the

15 square-mile **Nelson's Dockyard**

National Park. Initially developed as a

British Naval Base, in the late 18th century, it served as headquarters for the Leeward Islands

fleet. Horatio Nelson expanded the Georgian dockyard while commanding the armada.

NELSON'S DOCKYARD

Established and built up by the successive admirals Nelson, Rodney and Hood, Nelson's dockyard was regional base for British Naval operations during the Napoleonic Wars. The World Heritage site is an open-air museum.

Craftspeople ply their trades in the "old way" at the complex and visitors feel as though they have stepped into a the past. The harbor is filled with schooners and sleek modern cruisers from around the world, especially during the annual Sailing Week Regatta when an air of excitement prevails.

IN ST. JOHNS...

FORT JAMES

Named for King James II, Fort James was erected in the first few decades of the 1700s to secure the growing community against attack. Although barricades have fr

apart, the walls of the fort are in fine shape, and some of the original cannons remain.

The view of St. John's harbor is excellent and there is a fine restaurant at the point.

ST. JOHN'S CATHEDRAL

St. John's Cathedral is one of the capital's most visible landmarks — its white towers can be seen from any part of town. The stone church was first built in 1681, but earthquakes leveled it twice, first in 1745 and then again in 1813. The walls are now painted with thick

pine tar to make them sturdier. According to local legend, the two St. Johns statues at the gate came with Napoleon Bonaparte's fleet.

NATIONAL MUSEUM OF ANTIGUA

The Museum of Antigua and Barbuda was the (1750) courthouse. Relics represent the oldest known (Siboney) residents, Arawak culture, and includes a fine display of colonial antiques. Visitors are encouraged to touch various exhibits.

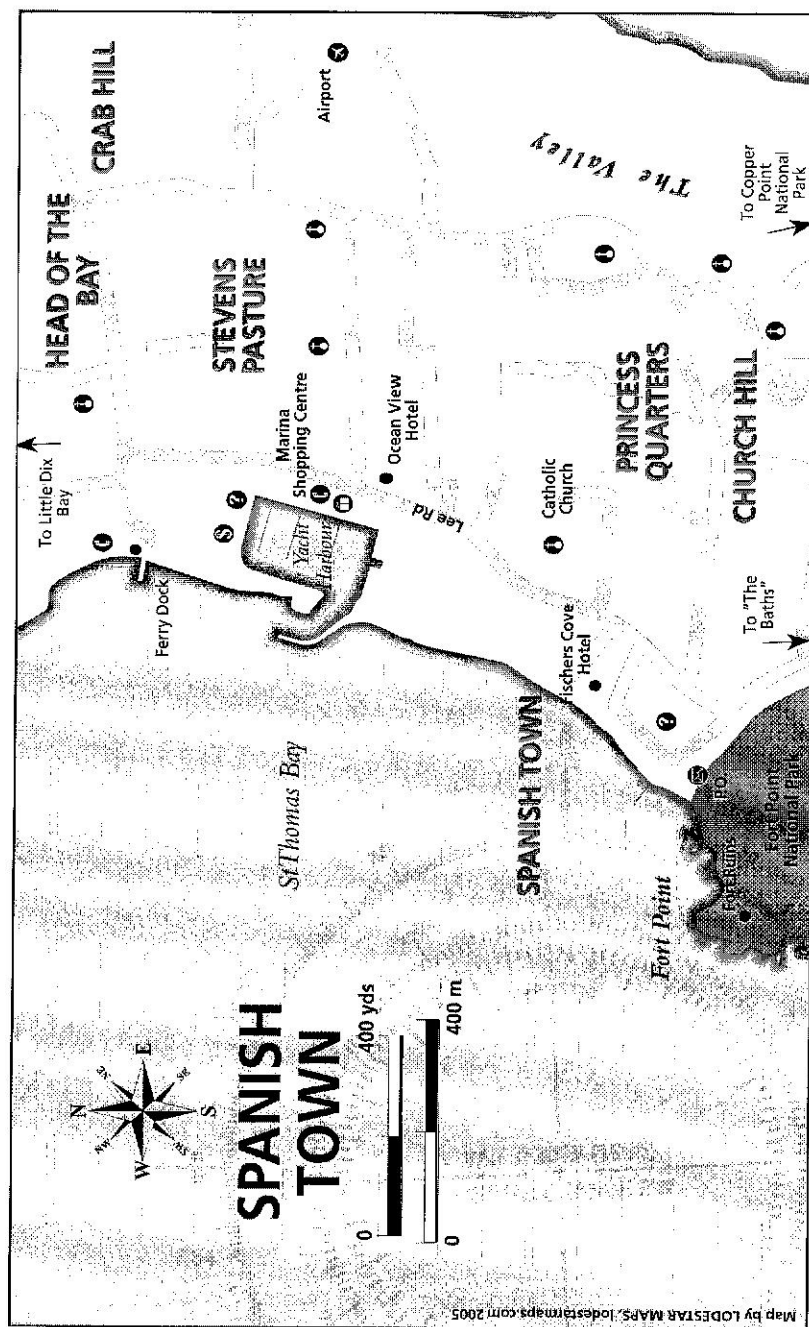
Seadream of ANTIGUA BEACHES

Antiguan ads promise a beach for each day of the year, and although it is probably an exaggeration, there are plenty of peaceful shores where you can relax and enjoy the sun and surf. Recommended swimming spots are all on the leeward (southwestern) side of the island. The Atlantic coast has dangerously strong currents that are risky for bathing. All beaches are public, and each resident seems to have a favorite.

Dickenson Bay and Runaway Bay are near St. Johns. Resorts dominate the coast in the parish, and beaches are lined with cafes. Marine sports equipment can be rented from any hotel in the area. On the opposite side of the harbor, isolated **Five Islands Peninsula** offers other beaches, including popular **Hawksbill Beach**.

On the hilly southwest, near Falmouth, beaches are typically less "developed" than are they are in the north. **Fryes Bay**,

Darkwood Beach, and **Johnsons Point** are good bets. **Doigs Beach** on **Red Bank** is particularly isolated, although there are no facilities and the beach is not easily accessible. Nearest English Harbor, **Pigeon Point** is a convenient beach stop.



VIRGIN GORDA

Sir Francis Drake Passage leads right past Spanish Town, Virgin Gorda's main commercial center. The surrounding community is known as **the Valley**. The ferry landing and airport are both nearby, and although it is a relatively recent innovation, all roads are paved. The rest of Virgin Gorda is rather hilly. **Gorda Peak**, the highest point, towers above 1,380 feet. Two interesting crags off the southern end, **Fallen Jerusalem** and **Broken Jerusalem**, are local landmarks. **Tiny Necker Island**, off the northeastern shore, was British airline magnate Richard Branson's private domain.

One of the most popular attractions is the natural stretch of coast that is romantically known as **the Baths**. Huge boulders that rest haphazardly on the beach were probably hurled from the festering mouth of a prehistoric volcano. Pools and grottoes formed by these great rocks offer swimming and snorkeling.

In the 17th century, not only British colonists, but also Dutch and French settlers took great interest in the archipelago. Remnants of the period include the preserved ruins at Little Fort National Park. The fort is not only a historic site, but also an important wildlife

sanctuary. **Prickly Pear National Park**, on the North Sound, is also a wildlife refuge. The natural areas have become popular among eco-tourists in recent years.

THE BATHS

Most people have heard about *the Baths*. Administered by the National Parks Trust, its house-sized boulders, gently sculpted by centuries of relentless surf, are nothing short of heavenly. Snorkel right off the beach! Delicate tidal pool-ecosystems are interspersed among the rock formations. **Mad Dog Restaurant** at the trailhead is a long-standing Baths tradition. Nearby, **Top of the Baths** is a second (larger) restaurant with several boutiques and a swimming pool. There is a refreshment and souvenir stand on the beach. *Ropes and wooden steps assist climbers over boulders. A winding dirt trail leads to the cave - walk with care.*

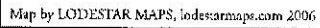

Squadrons of OTHER BEACHES

Spring Bay and Crawl National Park, the Baths' next-door neighbors, reveal more of the island's attractive shores. Somewhat smaller than its famous cousin, the beach is covered with sugary white sand and is also strewn with pigamic boulders. If the sea is calm, the water is clear, and snorkelers are well rewarded. A rough hiking trail (ear non-skid shoes) trail leads to adjacent and even more secluded **Trunk Bay**, favored among local surfers. High waves create strong undertow.

The inlets north of **Little Dix Bay** feature wide sandy beaches and offer attractive protected anchorages for small private yachts. **Pond Bay, Savannah Bay**, and **Long Bay**, east of Little Dix, are great places to "drift snorkel." Excursion boats drop equipped participants and guides into the warm water. They then head off down the current where they later meet their group. Sir Francis Drake Channel flows along the northern shores and supplies a gentle coastal current. *Do not venture too far from shore unless you want to take a "quick journey" to St. Thomas. Currents are swift near the middle of the channel. Do not swim alone.*



JOST VAN DYKE

Jost Van Dyke is the fourth largest of the British Virgin Islands. Named for a colonial-era Dutch pirate, the mountainous island is home to some 180 residents. The harbor is a magnet for private yachts, however, so the island can sometimes feel "full" (but *never* crowded!). *Foxy's Tamarind*, one of the most popular gathering places in the BVI, is famous throughout the region—especially on New Year's Eve when the establishment hosts an all night party to greet the calendar change.

Of Jost Van Dyke's 3 settlements, **Great Harbour** is the largest. Ferries arrive from

Tortola several times daily, so the ferry landing is especially busy. A series of tiny shops and bars line the shore adjacent to the dock. Landmark **Foxy's Tamarind**, the creation of local entertainer Foxy Callwood more than three decades ago, is one of the most popular. Foxy himself often visits his club. Other local restaurants like **Rudy's**

Marina Inn, **Club Paradise**, **Ali Baba**, and **Happy Laury's** are just a few steps away.

Everything is locally owned, and everyone knows everyone else. A single road rings the island's scant four square-miles. Visitors are welcomed with friendly smiles, but people will be sizing you up from the moment you meet them. Islanders are naturally friendly, but

they understand some people habitually hurry far too much to be able to appreciate their little slice of paradise. In response, they only shake their heads in pity (but never when you are looking - they are far too polite). The island's goats are about the fastest moving creatures on the island.

Tiny **Diamond Cay National Park** off the southeastern coast is protected nesting site and rookery for marine birds. Administered by the National Parks Trust, the site is one of many delicate ecosystems that are preserved by the forward-looking government.

There are few sandy beaches on the island.

Great Harbor Beach is a rather busy place with ferry traffic and commercial ventures.

White Bay, west of the ferry pier commands the adjacent cove. The sandy shore favors suntanning, and a coral reef protects the cove.

Jost Van Dyke was a Dutch privateer (pirate if you were not Dutch), one of several that favored the British Virgin Islands. After the pirate age, the tropical paradise was quiet until the end of the 17th century when Dutch, British, and French homesteaders once again took interest in the islands. Spaniards had moved on by then, so a British presence appeared and remained in control for nearly 300 years. African slaves powered sugar plantations, but when slavery was outlawed in 1834, the plantation economy failed, and many European settlers returned home. The other Virgin Islands did not go unnoticed. British forces occupied what is now American territory several times, but never managed to gain permanent control.

Islanders returned to farming until the 1960s, when investors began to notice the region. American Charles Carey, whose

Moorings company is the Caribbean's largest bareboat charterer, developed a marina on Tortola, and tourist traffic began to grow. Fortunately, the 1960s rush to commercialization bypassed BVI—and the circumstance was not accidental. Among other restrictions, strict building codes were established specifying a 2-story limit.

ST. CROIX, U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS

SNORKELING ON BUCK ISLAND

World-renowned Buck Island is a unique marine preserve just six miles off the St. Croix coast. The tiny pristine island is part of the National Park Service and is meticulously controlled and maintained. One side of the island has a beautiful white sand beach and the other - some of the best snorkeling in the Caribbean. A scenic 30-minute transfer by air-conditioned minivan drops you at the Christiansted pier where a chartered 40-foot power boat whisks you to the outer islands. Splash ashore and explore the beach, or don your mask to follow an underwater network of trails which lead through a living coral reef. Float through schools of multi-colored fish and forests of Elkhorn and Staghorn corals. Snorkeling gear is provided as well as instruction. After a great morning of beach and water, enjoy the relaxing journey back to SeaDream.

HORSEBACK RIDING IN THE RAIN FOREST

Just north of St. Croix's lush rain forest are the best stables on the island. After a short motor transfer from the SeaDream pier, saddle up with your guide and a riding instructor for a western-saddle adventure through the forest, following paths that rise up as high as 600 feet and offer excellent views. The ride is approximately two hours, and the horses will be allowed to trot and cantor depending on the skill level of the group. This tour is an unusual and wonderful way to explore the interior of this beautiful island.

ILES DES SAINTES, GUADELOUPE

The time is yours to explore this charming island, wander to the beach, do a little browsing or partake of the island's famous pastry confection – the tourment d'amour (the agony of love).

See beautiful Antigua on this adventurous off-road tropical safari in air-conditioned 4 x 4 vehicles. Take in the tropical scenery along the route as your driver-guide provides commentary. Points of interest include Body Pond, Fort George and Fig Tree Drive. A rough drive takes you up to Monk's Hill. Here you can explore the historic ruins of Fort George, originally built in the early 1700's. Monk's Hill also affords you a spectacular view of Falmouth Harbor and English Harbor. En route to one of Antigua's white sandy beaches for a short swim in the calm, clear waters you pass through Fig Tree Drive, Antigua's Rain Forest. After the beach, you will see more of Antigua's natural beauty during the return drive to your SeaDream yacht.

Note: This adventure takes you on a few rough roads, therefore it is not suitable for the physically challenged, very young children and expectant mothers.

St. John's offers a variety heritage landmarks and shopping options. Leaving Falmouth by air-conditioned bus accompanied by a local guide, a 30-40 minute drive brings you to Antigua's capital of St. John's. Entering St. John's your guide points out city highlights such as the Museum, the Anglican Cathedral and the Antigua Recreation Ground. Then it's time to shop!

You'll have about 2 hours to browse St. John's for goodies - from local craft items and souvenirs at the Arts and Craft Market and the Vendor's Mall, to Duty Free Shopping at Heritage Quay and Redcliffe Quay Malls in downtown. Stores in the malls offer virtually anything, including fine cigars and spirits, fragrances, artwork, clothing, leather goods, china, crystal, watches and designer labels. Your guide will specify the time and place to meet, then it's back to SeaDream waiting in Falmouth Harbor.

As the facility is right on a beautiful sand beach, chaise lounges and swimming are also available. Your encounter with these friendly and intelligent creatures is sure to be long remembered!

Open-air safari wagons drive you, fellow Sea-Dreamer, through the village of Spanish Town to discover The Baths, an intriguing group of sea caves and unusual rock formations. Follow the winding footpath down to the beach to explore this geological wonder. Wade knee deep through the sea caves formed by mammoth boulders and bask in the shafts of sunlight pouring through the natural ceiling into the pools below. Learn about the boulders' origins and the many curious names given to the rock formations. Swim, relax and enjoy the ambiance of this piece of paradise. Then, retrace your footprints in the sand and ascend the path for a refreshing drink before departing via the safari wagons for a scenic island drive over Gorda Peak to the north side, where a tender awaits to transfer you back to SeaDream, now at anchor in beautiful Gorda Sound.

Note: Please wear swimwear, towel and sunscreen. The portion of the adventure involving actual exploration of the cave area can be strenuous. Guests who prefer to enjoy the beach during this portion of the adventure are welcome to do so!

Begin with an educational briefing and orientation that outlines important information regarding dolphin behavior and anatomy. While you sit on the bleachers and listen to this interesting presentation, the anticipation builds for the actual encounter to follow. Then it's on to the platform pools to take turns entering the water and enjoying the 20-30 minute interaction involving swimming, hand signals and one-on-one contact. The trainers will help you understand the behaviors of the dolphins and assist you in maximizing your own personal experience.

You're sure to be both moved and revitalized as you reflect on your encounter en route back to Virgin Gorda and SeaDream.

Note: Please bring swimsuit, towel and sun protection. All participants must wear the provided flotation vest while in the water. Participation is limited. Please make your onboard arrangements early to avoid disappointment.

Baggage

Though we take all reasonable care in the handling of baggage, SeaDream Yacht Club's responsibility for lost, damaged or misplaced baggage and other personal property is limited to our handling on the yacht and limited by the Ticket Contract (Terms and Conditions section 9.B). SeaDream Yacht Club is not responsible for camera equipment, jewelry, cash or other similar fragile and valuable items contained in checked or unchecked baggage. These items, as well as medications or prescriptions, should be carried on and off our yacht by guests themselves. For your safety, all guests and all baggage must pass a security checkpoint. Baggage can be stored in your yacht stateroom in limited storage under your bed. If you have lost

airline luggage upon arrival in the port of embarkation you must contact the airline and file a claim. At times, your airline might not be able to locate your luggage before the yacht's departure. In that case, our staff onboard will handover a copy of your lost baggage claim form to our local port agent, who will continue to assist you obtaining information about your baggage from the airline. If your baggage is located after the yacht's departure, our port agent will contact the yacht for further instructions. Please note that SeaDream does not assume any liability for the loss or delay of your baggage by the airline and / or the cost of forwarding. SeaDream strongly recommends that you purchase travel insurance that will cover the loss and / or delay of your baggage.

Bedding

Most staterooms may be setup with either a queen size bed or (two) twin beds. Synthetic or down pillows are available upon request. Please make preferences known on the Guest Registration Form prior to embarkation. The following staterooms have queen bed configuration only:

Boutique

Choose from a selection of designer glassware, fine crystal, jewelry, silver, pewter, clothing, logo items and other gift items as well as sunscreen / lotions, films and batteries. The Boutique is closed in port due to local customs regulations. Hours at sea are listed in the Daily Program. You may also visit www.seadreamyachtclub.com if you like to purchase selected items online.

Casino

Try your luck at blackjack and poker in the Casino on Deck 4. It is open every day at sea when not restricted by maritime law. Hours will be listed in the Daily Program. Our Casino is operated by Casinos Austria, who sets gaming rules and extends gambling credit to the casino guests by using Visa, Diners Club or Master Card (EuroCard) only. The maximum daily charge allowed is USD 400.00 per day per card, for a total maximum of USD 1,200.00. Shipboard credits can not be used for Casino charges nor does SeaDream Yacht Club extend credit for casino use.

Please note that yacht's rules prohibit guests under the age of 18 from entering the

gaming area.

Children

An adult must accompany children under 18 years of age traveling with SeaDream Yacht Club. If that adult is not the legal parent or guardian, written permission from the parent is required. Without a written permission from the parents or proof of legal guardian, you will be denied boarding. Children under the age of one (1) are not permitted onboard our yachts.

Clothing Ashore

Naturally, the weather on your sailing depends on the itinerary you have chosen. Layering your clothes always works best. For tropical voyages, bring light, loose fitting garments that can be paired with a lightweight jacket or sweater. If you wear glasses, it's a good idea to pack an extra pair. Good walking, hiking or biking shoes are a must. Proper swim and summer wear is an excellent idea for those who enjoy using jet skis, sail boats, kayaks and other yacht toys. We also recommend sunglasses for your comfort. When dressing to go ashore or while going on land adventures, you will want to take into consideration the customs of the countries you are visiting. Our staff will brief you on local requirements.

Clothing Aboard the Yacht

Whether in the daytime or evening, the general atmosphere on board is elegant, yet casual (Country Club Casual), and you will enjoy dressing comfortably while indulging in a variety of activities. Shorts and other more casual attire are welcomed in the Topside Restaurant during breakfast and lunch. Swimsuits, brief shorts, exercise clothing and cover-ups should be reserved for poolside lounging, water sports, deck activities and the Spa. In the evening, suits, gowns, ties and tuxedos are not required. Instead, men wear casual attire such as trousers and shirt, jacket or blazer preferred, but not required. Ties not required. Women wear dresses, skirts or pants with casually elegant tops.

Shorts, jeans or T-shirts are not permitted in the evening in the Dining Salon or other public rooms.

Incoming faxes and e-mails will be delivered to your stateroom. Internet access is available for a nominal charge in the library at stationary computers and / or within your stateroom with your own laptop or one utilized from the yacht.

Deck Chairs

Deck chairs are abundant, complimentary and may not be reserved.

Dining

As satisfying as the most extraordinary dining experience ashore, the Dining Salon and Topside Restaurant aboard the SeaDream I and SeaDream II feature elegant open seating arrangements for breakfast, lunch and dinner. At lunch and dinner enjoy complimentary wines that are selected to enhance the menus of the day. The wine steward will provide a list of excellent premium wines that are also available at an additional charge. In addition to restaurant service all guests may also enjoy:

- Early Riser's Coffee & freshly baked Pastries
- Afternoon Tea & Sandwiches
- Cocktail party & Hors d'oeuvres

If you require a special diet or if you need to have special food items available aboard the yacht, please indicate this on the Guest Registration Form and we will try to

obtain your item locally if available. Please reconfirm with the Hotel Manager or Maitre d' onboard. Dining hours vary depending on yacht sailing regions and will be posted in the Daily Program.

Disabled Guests

SeaDream yachts have limited facilities for guests in wheelchairs or for those with significant health problems. Existing medical problems or physical disabilities, which may call for treatment by the yacht's medical staff or for assistance during embarkation, must be brought to the attention of SeaDream Yacht Club well in advance of departure. Complete information on wheelchair accessibility will be given to you at that time. SeaDream has alert kits for guests with hearing impairments which can be fitted to any stateroom. These kits include visual notification for the door knocker and smoke alarm and there is a vibrating alarm and phone amplifier. Please notify in advance if this equipment is needed. Service dogs are permitted with the required documentation but may not be allowed to disembark at all ports. Stateroom 215 is larger than other units and may be requested when making a reservation.

Disembarkation by Guests

Due to Customs clearance and Immigration procedures, you should allow at least two hours after arrival at your disembarkation destination. Your arrangements for transportation should be made with this in mind. We recommend that you allow at least three to four hours between the yacht's scheduled arrival and your airline flight departure depending on the disembarkation port.

Electrical Appliances

Electrical sockets of 110 and 220 volt are available in all staterooms. If you have any questions about the appropriate place to plug in shavers, hair dryers, etc., please ask your stewardess.

Embarkation by Guests

The yacht will be available for guests boarding at 2:00 pm. As the amenities of passenger terminals vary greatly and some are not comfortable places to wait, we recommend that you do not arrive at the yacht's berth before the time indicated. When making your airline flight arrangements, be sure to allow at least three hours between your scheduled flight arrival and the sailing time. Make sure you are at the correct pier before dismissing your transportation. Upon embarkation proper passport and visa documentation is inspected and collected and security clearance is required.

E-Mail

E-mail and internet access is available in the Library at stationary desktop computers and within your stateroom with your own laptop or one utilized from the yacht. Charges for use of the internet are posted to your account.

Entertainment

Music in the Main Salon is provided for your listening and dancing pleasure, or enjoy our cocktail pianist at the Piano Bar or Top of the Yacht Bar nightly. DVD's and CD's are available for your use from the reception and can be played within your stateroom. You may also bring your own DVD's and CD's. Guests may also request a MP3 player with over 170 hours of music for your listening pleasure. The Yacht Activities Director will take guests requests to play your favorite DVD in the Main Salon. Events are listed in the Daily Program delivered to your stateroom every evening.

Gift Orders

Gift Orders are available prior to departure. Gifts can range from fine champagnes, wine cellar credit as well as onboard spa or shipboard credit. Call (305) 631-6100 and ask us to send a gift order form by facsimile or e-mail to place orders using a credit card.

Guest Questionnaire

A guest questionnaire will be delivered to your stateroom near the end of the voyage. Your comments are requested and much appreciated. Every comment is reviewed by the Chief Executive Officer of the company.

Guest Registration Form

To serve you better and to satisfy international government regulations, it is extremely important that you complete this form when received and return it immediately. Your voyage documents will not be issued until SeaDream Yacht Club has received the completed Guest Registration Form. You or your Travel Agent may fill this form out online at our website at www.seadreamgrf.com or fax the form to (305) 631-6110.

Land Adventures

Enhance your experience with SeaDream's custom-designed Land Adventures. These are fully outlined and included with your documents. Our professional staff onboard can also set up private arrangements such as individual guides and private car / drivers. Land Adventures can be purchased on board, at the Reception Desk. There will be a Land Adventure Request Form in your stateroom. Throughout your sailing there will be informative briefings, announced in the Daily Program, which will include shopping advice, and other practical suggestions for the ports you will visit. For detailed information on activities in each port, see our website at www.seadreamyachtclub.com.

Language

English is the official language on board, and all announcements and printed information are in English. The officers and the crew are international; so many languages are spoken onboard.

Laundry and Dry Cleaning

Full laundry, pressing and dry cleaning services are available on board for a nominal charge. Your stewardess will take care of pick-up and delivery. Same-day service is standard if delivered by 10:00 am. For safety reasons, irons and ironing boards are not permitted in your stateroom.

Library

The Library on Deck 4 contains a large selection of books, ranging from the classics to bestsellers, available 24 hours a day. Magazines are also available for your use while onboard. Two stationary computers are available for your use and have standard business software installed. Internet access and e-mail is also available at an established charge.

Mail and Messages

You will receive telephone and fax numbers for the yacht with your voyage tickets.

Postage for outgoing letters and postcards is available at the Reception Desk and will be charged to your onboard account. Outgoing and incoming messages will be charged to your account.

Medical Services at Sea

The yacht's small, basic medical facility, staffed by a doctor, is located on Deck 5. This facility is equipped to provide limited medical care for illness or accidents that may arise during the sailing. It is not intended to provide ongoing medical treatment for pre-existing conditions. If you anticipate a need for medical services aboard the yacht, your special requirements must be cleared in writing with SeaDream Yacht Club. Since we are either at sea or in ports where availability of medical facilities and pharmaceutical products may be limited, we suggest you bring adequate supplies of prescription medications and other health related items. Charges for medical assistance will be billed to your shipboard account.

Money Matters

The official currency onboard is the U.S. Dollar. Although most services aboard SeaDream I and II are included in your fare (such as restaurant dining and room service, entertainment programs, use of sports and water sports equipment and the services of a highly trained staff), charges will be made to your onboard account for non-complimentary alcoholic beverages and personal items.

Items and services that can be charged to your on board account include:

- All non-complimentary alcoholic beverages
- Dry cleaning, laundry and valet service
- Beauty salon, massage and other spa treatments
- Satellite and radio-telephone calls, faxes, e-mail and internet access
- Land Adventures and use of the Segway HT
- Medical consultation and medication
- Miscellaneous hotel and restaurant charges, such as those for entertaining guests
- Boutique purchases
- Special miscellaneous arrangements

Please present one of your major credit cards, and sign a charge slip at embarkation. This will relieve you from settling your account at the Reception Desk at the end of your voyage. Instead a detailed statement will be delivered to your stateroom and processed automatically at the end of the voyage. Guests may use Visa, MasterCard, Diners Club or American Express. Accounts may be settled with cash, traveler's checks or credit card.

We encourage you to carry your personal funds in the form of traveler's checks, both for convenience and safety. Personal checks or letters of credit cannot be honored. Cash advances are not permitted against your on board account or any form of credit card.

The Reception Desk handles all money matters and are available for any questions. Information will be available on board as to the most convenient exchange facility in each port.

Mountain Bikes

There are 10 mountain bikes available for guests to take ashore. Guests will need to

sign out for the bicycle at the reception. A helmet and lock will be provided.

News Service

CNN international is normally available 24 hours on the flat screen TV in your stateroom. World News reports are transmitted to the yacht by satellite and a copy may be collected at the reception desk.

Onboard Bookings

Your next voyage can be booked onboard with the Club and Activities Director. This booking is eligible for a 5% saving on the voyage fare. A 25% deposit is required to activate this saving. The deposit paid is fully refundable within 30 days after the onboard booking date. After the 30 day period you are required to pay in full if the new sailing is within 90 days of departure.

Passports and Visas

Passports – The only accepted form of identification by SeaDream is a valid passport regardless of the region our yachts are sailing. It is highly recommended that your passport is valid for at least six months beyond your expected date of return and has blank pages for visas or authority stamps.

Visas – Depending on your nationality, you may be required to obtain visas from the consulates of multiple countries on your itinerary. Failure to obtain the necessary visas may result in serious delays and additional charges during embarkation or in denied boarding. Please check with the proper government agency for visa requirements.



Pets and Animals

Pets and animals are not permitted on board except as noted in the disabled guest section.

Pool

Our saltwater swimming pool is located on deck 3.

Reception

The Reception Desk handles all money matters as well as guest inquiries.

A wide variety of DVD's, from action blockbuster hits to timeless classics, are complimentary and available for checkout at the Reception Desk during opening hours. CD's are also available for guest convenience.

Religious Services

There are no religious services aboard SeaDream I & II. However, the Club and Activities Director can assist you with special arrangements when the yacht is in port.

Room Service

Complimentary room service is available from the 24-hour menu found in the leather folder in your stateroom.

Safe

Your stateroom is provided with a private safe and may be used without charge.

Safety at Sea

SeaDream yachts are among the safest afloat, in full compliance with all US and international regulations. An emergency drill for guests will be held before the yacht sails from her embarkation port on each voyage. Attendance at these drills is mandatory, in accordance with International Maritime Law. Emergency procedures and lifeboat number are posted on the door in your stateroom. In addition to actively participating in the scheduled drills, we urge you to study this information carefully and to familiarize yourself with the use of life jackets, which are provided for every guest. Emergency telephone numbers are listed in your stateroom.

Smoking Policy

For the comfort and convenience of all our guests, smoking is permitted outside on Deck 3, Deck 4 and Deck 6. Smoking inside the vessel is not permitted.

Staterooms

Each yacht has 55 staterooms. The Owner's Suite is 450 square feet with a large ocean view window and a permanent queen size bed including a separate living area. Yacht Club staterooms are 195 square feet and Commodore Club staterooms are two Yacht Club staterooms combined for a total 390 square feet. A 3rd guest (a child of less than twelve) may be accommodated on the sofa.

Spa, Health Club and Beauty Salon

Indulge yourself with aromatherapy massages, facials and body wraps. The Asian Spa and Health Club on deck four features all of this, plus a sauna and steam room, gymnasium and fitness classes. The Health Club has treadmills, elliptical machines and recumbent bikes as well as free weights. The Beauty Salon offers also manicures and pedicures. A complete program of services is available onboard and can be viewed on line at www.seadreamyachtclub.com.

Sun beds

Balinese sun beds are available on deck six and need not be reserved.

Tenders

Unless local authorities dictate otherwise, SeaDream uses an enclosed tender to take you ashore in those ports where the yacht anchors.



Valuables

There is a private safe in each stateroom for your convenience.

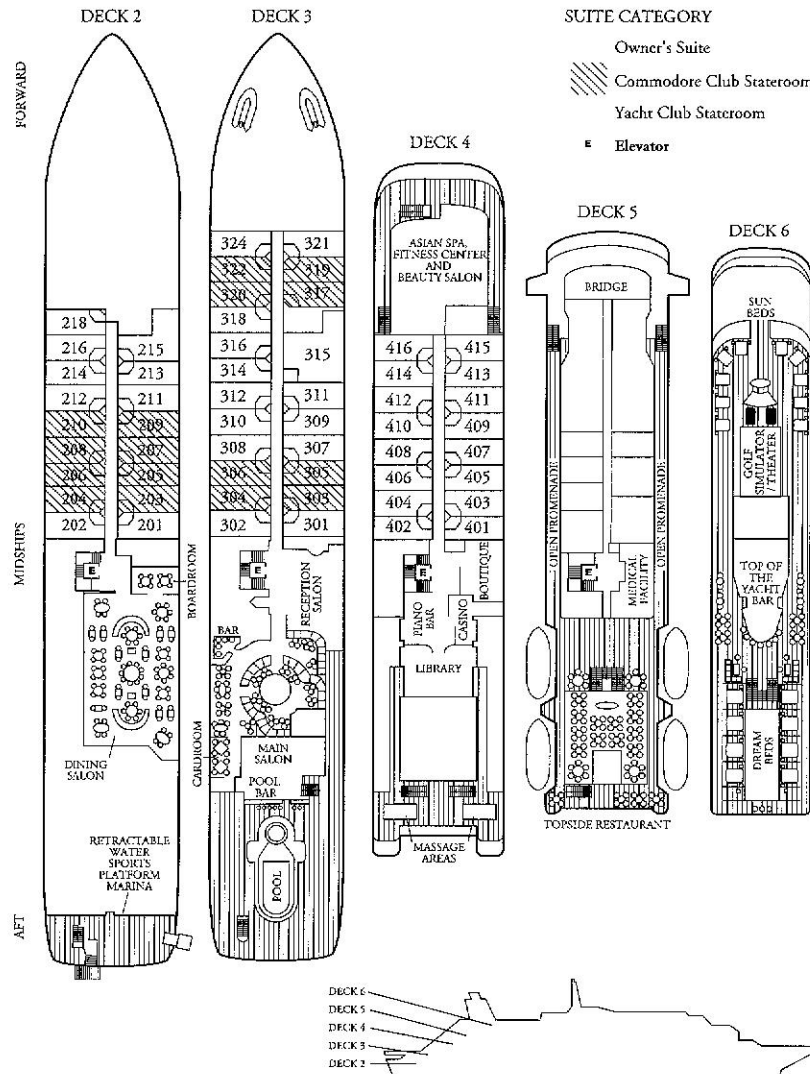
Visitors

In ports of call, a limited number of visitors per stateroom are permitted, subject to security and safety conditions at the time. Applications for visitors should be made on board, at least 24 hours in advance. If you would like to invite your guests for Lunch or Dinner please notify the Hotel Manager or Maitre'd. A USD 25.00 per person charge for Lunch and USD 50.00 per person charge for Dinner will be added to your onboard account. Included in this charge is the full menu selection, the complimentary wines, alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages to accompany the meal and all gratuities.

Water Sports Platform

When the yacht is at anchor, and where conditions and local authorities permit, the yacht is able to lower a unique water sports platform, allowing guests to enjoy swimming, snorkeling, kayaking, windsurfing, water and jet skiing. Please note that Greece and the British Virgin Islands do not allow SeaDream to operate motorized water sport equipment. Children under the age of 16 years must be accompanied by a parent or guardian when utilizing any / all sports activity equipment. A waiver must be signed prior to using any water toys and a safety video is available for those wishing to use the jet skis. Guest agrees to follow the instructions of the sports staff to insure safety and meet local requirements. If you violate local laws and the yacht is fined this will be added to your shipboard account. Using the water sports equipment is not allowed if guests have consumed alcohol.
